

The student union (ÖH) is the voice of fellow students on important university decisions.



Academic Honesty & Plagiarism

The entire MU community strives to promote an environment that fosters the professional growth and development of all students while maintaining a high academic standard. The qualities of honesty and integrity are essential to this environment.

Remember that any action or attempted action intended to give students an unfair advantage regarding academic work is considered academic misconduct. Plagiarism and cheating are serious offences that may lead to a student being expelled from the university. Please consult the <u>Guide to Understanding Plagiarism</u> brochure.

Attendance Policy

Attendance is mandatory in all courses at Modul University, except for *interactive lectures* and the lecture portion of *lecture/seminar* and *lecture/exercise* type courses. If you miss more than 20% of mandatory course sessions, you will obtain a failing grade of 0%. When missing course sessions, the ACO strongly recommends that students complete the Special Consideration Form and submit it to your instructor without delay, as late requests are often not considered. Absences are generally only excused for significant issues beyond a student's control (i.e. medical reasons). Note that overlaps with other courses are not considered valid reasons for missing course sessions.

After the official online course registration closes, changes to course registration are only permitted:

1) if an extended course registration period has been indicated on your course syllabus (for undergraduate, MSc and PhD courses) / up to two weeks prior to the course for blocked courses in the MBA/MSc programs, and

2) if the rules and regulations allow. All requests to change a student's course registration after the official registration period shall be directed to the Academic Office.

A fee applies for each late change. Please view MU's <u>Guidelines on Fees</u> for further information.

Internships

Three- and four- year BBA students, as well as students enrolled in the BSc in International Management with Professional Experience, must complete a mandatory internship as part of their study program. For students enrolled in the BSc Applied Data Science slightly different regulations apply. The Academic Office is responsible for the administration of the internship, and happily supports you. During your studies you need to complete 900 working hours, domestically or abroad, to be counted towards your internship. These 900 hours can be completed in one part during your internship semester, or in two equal parts of 450 hours duration each. Students will only receive ECTS points for the internship if all steps have been completed on time in the correct sequence. All three MSc programs offer the option to do a full-time OR part-time (min. 340 hours) graduate internship instead of two enrichment courses (6 ECTS). The Academic Office is responsible for the administration of the



internship program and, together with the SSC, is happy to support you in your search for a great internship. The internship can be completed either domestically or abroad within the area of studies.

International Mobility

MU encourages international and intercultural diversity and study abroad. Any student can apply for an exchange, but students with a good academic record and extracurricular participation have the best chance of acceptance. To apply, you need to write a motivation letter and fill out an application. You will then be invited to an interview with a Liaison Officer. More information about study abroad can be found on the university website.

Residency Permit

Upon arrival in Austria, it is important to register with the local authorities within 3 days of arrival. The *Meldezettel* (registration form) which must also be signed by your host (e.g.: student dorm, landlord if you are renting privately) on the bottom left, is the form they are requesting you to bring in. If you are staying in a student dorm, they will (most likely) have the signed form prepared for you upon arrival. In case you have not received it, please contact them.

The completed registration form needs to be taken to the magistrate office (<u>Magistratisches Bezirksamt</u>) in your district. You will then receive a computer printout which is your *Meldezettel* that is used for official purposes (for instance your student visa). Please be sure to scan the document and keep it in a safe place. From your message it seems that you are already properly registered.

Apart from the registration process it is highly recommended to open a bank account and ensure that you have adequate **health and accident insurance** (for instance through the <u>Austrian insurance system ÖGK</u>). One of the most commonly used packages for international students is <u>Feelsafe</u>. This type of insurance is also accepted by the immigration authorities.

Please make sure to finalize your residency permit student within the timeframe of your visa D. As the lead times of working with the immigration authorities are rather long this is one of the most pressing items of action.

Anyone who has submitted an *Erstantrag* and wishes to finalize it, should book an appointment as soon as possible through this link: <u>https://www.wien.gv.at/kontakte/ma35/terminvereinbarung-drittstaaten.html</u> (only use "Termine im Referat 1.2 buchen" - green button)

Please understand that the Academic Office is responsible for issuing study confirmation (*Studienblatt* und *Studienbestätigung*). Also note that these documents will only be available once the semester has started. Nevertheless, it is important to schedule an appointment with the MA35 as outlined above.

Extensions of your residency permit are only possible in Austria as early as 3 months before the expiration of the current residency permit. For detailed information about the renewal process please contact our residency permit department under visa@modul.ac.at.

All EU citizens must complete a <u>registration process</u> as well within 4 months of arrival. You will be required to bring proof of having secured housing (rental contract and *Meldezettel*) as well as proof of having insurance coverage and sufficient monetary funds to sustain yourself.

Student Cards



Your student card grants you access to the building, enables you to make copies, and, importantly, facilitates food purchases at the cafeteria. To load funds onto your card, please utilize the machine in the cafeteria along with your ATM card.

If you lose your student ID, a replacement card can be obtained at the Academic Office (academicoffice@modul.ac.at) by paying a fee of $20 \in$ at the accounting office.

MU Tutoring

We currently offer group tutoring sessions for students who feel additional support in certain subjects would be beneficial. Tutoring sessions are delivered by our very own students who have been recommended by the faculty and who have shown outstanding commitment to their own studies.

Code of Conduct

Expectations:

MU wants to create a vibrant community spirit among its students and encourages an open and inclusive learning environment that is conducive to an open exchange of ideas and perspective. For this reason, all MU students are expected to be active members of the MU community and treat their fellow students with dignity and respect. MU students are not only strongly encouraged but also expected to address open academic and personal (e.g.: housing, residency permit, intercultural and other) issues proactively and in a friendly and solution-oriented manner. MU faculty and staff are committed to assisting students and ensuring their academic success and personal development.

General House Rules

- All members of the university including students, staff, and faculty shall treat all persons equally independent of sex, ethnicity, nationality, religion, or sexual orientation. If a person is affected by discrimination, he/she can contact the Inclusion and Diversity Committee (IDC) for support.
- The university building is a private building. Only members of the university, including students, staff, faculty, and their guests, are allowed to enter.
- The kitchen on the lower level is for staff and faculty use only.
- Posters and announcements must be approved by the Student Services Center (SSC). Persons who put up posters on the walls are liable for damage caused by the removal of posters.
- Smoking is strictly prohibited in the University building. Please use designated smoking areas only. This
 includes the use of e-cigarettes.
- Furniture may not be moved into or outside of the building.
- Parking for students is only permitted in the large parking lot and not on the road in front of the university.

GLOSSARY

Aufenthaltstitel 'Studierender' – The official Austrian term. In English we would say: Student Residence Permit.

CEFR – An abbreviation in language learning which stands for 'Common European Framework of Reference for Languages'. This framework is recognized across Europe and is used at Modul University to describe the level of our language courses.

ECTS – An abbreviation which stands for 'European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System'. It is used as a standard for comparing the attainment INFORMATION of students in higher education across Europe.

ERASMUS – An abbreviation which stands for 'European Region Action Scheme for the Mobility of University Students'. It is a European student exchange program which was established in 1987.

Magistratisches Bezirksamt – This is the title for the municipal offices in each Viennese district whose duties include processing the 'Meldezettel' and preparing a 'Meldebestätigung' for you.

MA 35 – An abbreviation which stands for *Magistratsabteilung 35*. This is the municipal office responsible for dealing with student residence permits (amongst other things).

Meldebestätigung – The official document that you receive from the authorities after you have submitted your *Meldezettel* (see below). You should keep this document safe since you will need it in order to open a bank account.

Meldezettel – The form that you need to complete within three working days of arriving in Vienna, in order to register your address with the authorities.

Semesterkarte – A student transport card allowing students to use the Viennese public transport network for a reduced rate.

Studienbestätigung – The German term for a 'confirmation of studies'. This form is produced as a triplicate and can therefore be cut out and used three times.

Studienbuchblatt – The German term for a 'confirmation of enrollment'. This form is a little more official than the 'confirmation of studies' and states the first day of enrolment as well as the expected completion date. This form is needed for the student health insurance as offered by the ÖGK.

ÖGK – An abbreviation which stands for 'Österreichische Gesundheitskasse'. The ÖGK offers a reduced rate student health insurance.
